#### onliny officer writing analysis from Scott Haa

- End of December numbers
  - Significant decrease
- Stop-Loss credit for \$134,000
  - More anticipated--at least \$90,000
- Mechanics of plan starting to true up. Hopefully a better end of plan year
  - o 2019-2020 plan year compared to 2018-2019 right now is 21.7% PEPM increase
  - Rolling Year-to-Date is 104% loss, might be moderated by stop-loss reimbursements.
- Large Claims Analysis
  - 7 claims currently in excess of 50% of stop-loss threshold
    - <1% of plan members = 44% of costs
    - A new large claim, a one off situation, has not hit budget sheet yet
- Dental summary:
  - Leveling out
- Prescription drugs:
  - "Running largely okay" with a negative trend (except for October and November)

### **Renewal Calculations with Scott Haas**

- Separated medical from prescription drug claims to better illustrate breakdown in costs over the last 24 months
  - 76.9% medical
  - 23.1% prescription
  - USI to begin a rating methodology
    - Our plan is below national trends in RX costs
- 28.31% PEPM increase for next year based on very conservative estimates
  - Assumes worst case for TPA and Stop-Loss renewal
- Stop-loss renewal:
  - USI breaking down numbers, trying to find break even level between stop loss pay out and what we pay in.
  - Years ago, we received more than we paid in.
- Dental trend:
  - "Flat as can be"
  - Still assuming 5% increase, but that would be ceiling
- Clinic costs not yet factored into renewal rates. Should have those by February, if not then March
- RightWay

- A secondary service. FCH is offering
- o Case Management, Benefits Management, Patient Advocacy
- \$3 PEPM. Based on projections ~\$20,000 per year
  - Would also potentially save us money through effective case management and patient advocacy.
- Seems to be a more effective and streamlined update to FCH's previous transparency tools
- o Tracy Scott and Braumlee Boyce are opposed, "not worth cost"
- o Opting out of RightWay would leave us with just over a 27% rate increase
- This is the kind of service we have thoughtfully considered before. As this
  information was just presented the morning of the meeting
  - no action was taken
- Scott will provide itemized summary of admin fee renewal information
- Target for rate renewal: April 9th
- Finance committee has asked Scott to speak at February 28th at 7:30 AM

### Subrogation update:

- Kalispell Public Schools to remove claim
  - Montana state law will make it functionally impossible for KPS to recoup any cost from deck collapse
- No attorney fees
- Committee unanimously recommends we drop the claim.

## Clinic Update from Jack Fallon

- There has been a pre-bid construction meeting
  - o "Guess-timate" of \$145,000
    - Have to go out to bid
    - Will go to board February 11th or 25th
- Other participants are interested.
  - Originally just wanted to have KPS initially but other groups may want to jump in quickly in exchange for share of the costs and facility use fees
- Lease is \$1,500 and utilities, plus snow removal
  - 5 year lease
- 40% utilization would recoup costs in first year
- First year could be dicey

- Kim Oliver at FCH working closely with USI and KRH
  - More updates for February Meeting
- Waiting on MRI and CT case rates
- Starting to also get case rates from Missoula
